SELF BUILD CHECKLIST

Do you want a kit house (a timber frame home that is prefabricated, using one of a number of set designs) or do you want a bespoke home designed for you? (If you buy a kit house, you will need to make sure it fits your requirements and is suitable for your plot.)

Minimum number of bedrooms required. Is this likely to change in future?

How many levels/floors do you want in the house?

Minimum size of plot needed (see the Self Build Guide for Scotland or self build websites)

How much storage space do you need? Where abouts do you need this and what for?

Indicate if your home needs to be within a maximum distance of work or children's schools. (You may wish to list the towns/ villages/area you want to consider.)

Indicate if you have any preferences about the orientation of different rooms. For example, if you want sunlight in the main bedroom in the morning or in the living room in the evening. Or if you want to maximise energy efficiency by maximising the sunlight coming into key rooms (known as solar gain).
